...from Fr. Gerard

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

We Americans don't do well with commandments, unless it's in the context of the military, police, or firefighting. And even then, we find examples of commanding authority being questioned. We tend to think of commandments as obstacles to real freedom, imposed by some tyrant who just wants to be in control. But Jesus casts the commandments in the context of love. He does not insist on any obligation to follow them; rather, he says that whoever observes his commandments "is the one who loves me." Jesus said the two greatest commandments are to "love thy Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39) - even the commands he gives us are rooted in love, not legalism.

One of the questions I ask students is, "Which of the ten commandments is hardest for someone your age to follow?" It should come as no surprise that honoring one's mother and father is the most popular response. When I ask them why this commandment is an important one for them to follow, they often respond, "Because our parents love and care about us and want what is best for us." How true.

When we truly love someone, we desire to make them happy. Unfortunately, we get mixed up sometimes and think that the way to make others happy is for there to be no rules, commandments, or expectations. Following God's commandments is ultimately about the pursuit of happiness. Understanding the word "commandment" in these terms helps us to realize that the commandments don't stifle us, they satisfy us! God doesn't restrict our freedom; he respects it. Ultimately, it is our choice whether or not we will follow the commandments that allow us to live the life of love that Jesus offers us.

MOTHER'S DAY - Earlier this year, on the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, Pope Francis spoke of the Blessed Mother as a Mother of Hope. In gratitude for the mothers we honor today, and particularly those who act as our spiritual mothers, I share with you some of his reflection:

Holy Mother of God! Many books and weighty tomes have been written about this title of Our Lady. Yet these words have mostly entered the minds and hearts of the holy People of God through the simple and familiar prayer that accompanies the rhythm of our days, our moments of weariness and our greatest aspirations: the Hail Mary. After a few phrases drawn from the word of God, the second part of the prayer continues: "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners..."

This invocation, often repeated throughout the day, has allowed God to draw near, through Mary, to our lives and our history. "Mother of God, pray for us sinners..." It is recited in the most diverse languages, on the beads of a rosary and, at times of need, in the presence of a holy image or walking along the way.

To this invocation, the Mother of God always responds; she hears our petitions; holding her Son in her arms, she blesses us and brings us the tender love of God made flesh. In a word, Mary gives us hope. At the beginning of this year, we need hope, just as the earth needs rain. This year, that opens with the celebration of God's Mother and our own, tells us that the key to hope is Mary and that the antiphon of hope is the invocation, Holy Mother of God.

Our mothers are often the people who give us hope. Seeing beyond the despair of a particular moment, they inspire us to trust in ourselves and God. Their voices remain with us, guiding and nurturing us even into our adult lives. We thank all mothers for being the first of teachers in the ways of faith, and pray that the Lord will reward them for their sacrifices. May the Blessed Mother's intercession for them assist them in the care they provide for us.

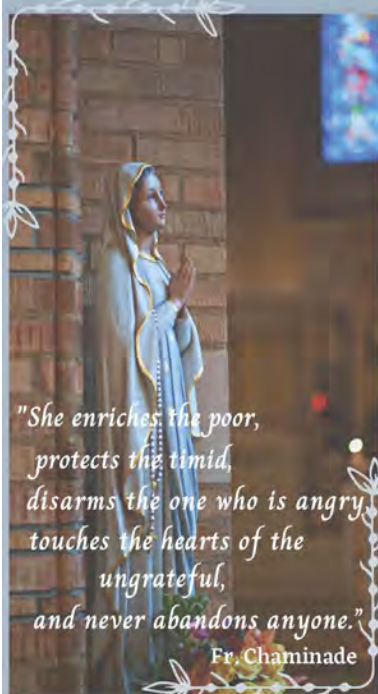

How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. *(Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).*

Parish Prayer Intention Book: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

Prayer Line Ministry: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.
