

Fr. Ken's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint Rose of Lima,

As we look forward to a New Year with a greater sense of hope, today we look behind us at the financial report for the fiscal year of 2019-2020 which ended on August 31, 2020.

Our Parish of St. Rose has been affected, like every other institution, since this pandemic began back in early February. We've all had to make drastic changes in our lives, from wearing masks – both indoors and outdoors – departing from our usual routines in regard to meetings, social gatherings and parties, and no big crowds at sports events. Who would have thought a year ago that because of the pandemic, our churches would need to be closed for a few months in an abundance of caution for the safety of all our parishioners? Who would have thought that we would need to continue livestreaming our Masses?

Because of continued concerns among our senior citizens for their health – always so faithful in their attendance – I salute the many who are continuing to participate in our Sunday liturgies from home via our livestreaming service. I also applaud all the families who continue to protect their children through social distancing by watching our online streaming as a family. To those who have been present for mass, congratulations for complying with masking and distancing. Everyone should know that our in-person Sunday attendance is DOWN – over 60% of what it was a year ago.

We've all been ground down both physically and emotionally, and everyone's finances have taken a substantial hit. Our own parish church is no different. Although the past few months have been a very difficult time, I wholeheartedly THANK all of the many faithful and generous parishioners who have taken the motto "Massapequa Strong" and have made us "St. Rose Strong" through your weekly offerings. I am very appreciative of the small number of our people who have increased their weekly contributions upon realizing that our parish obligations — especially in Parish Outreach - haven't changed, but actually increased. Please contact Outreach if you (or if you know someone who) is in need of food; call me if you need a kind word.

Please look at the enclosed report. Although the net increase looks favorable, it does not accurately reflect our current financial situation. While income for the reported period is on the black side of the ledger, understandably income from our weekly Mass collections is down. The positive numbers are in large part due to proceeds from the PPP loan, our cost saving measures, and there is no allocation for future Capital Improvements.

As priest and pastor, my first concern is always your spiritual health and growth. As head of the household of this family of St. Rose, I share the same financial concerns that you have, confident in knowing we are "All in this together" and that we'll make it through these hard times together. I again THANK everyone who has sent in their weekly or monthly envelopes, and I THANK all those who have signed up and supported us through online giving.


As we wait for that 'light at the end of the tunnel' with vaccine distribution, keep the faith, keep tabs on those close to you, and keep on praying that 2021 will be a time of healing the wounds inflicted this past year. It is my hope and prayer that we'll continue to help and sustain one another until that day when we can hug without fear, when we can have an innocent cough without people moving away from us, and we can fill the pews of our church with people praising and thanking God for delivering us from this evil and preparing us for life everlasting.




