

...from Fr. Gerard

Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!

"Are you ready for Christmas?" Whenever that question is asked, it would seem that the inquisitor is either gloating about his or her preparedness or hoping that my lack of preparedness will make them feel better about their own preparation status. There are always more tasks to accomplish, gifts to buy, presents to wrap, decorations to put up, cookies to bake, and cards to write. The inevitable answer is, "NO!" There is not enough time to get everything done. The church asks us if we are ready for Christmas with a different intention in mind. This Gaudete Sunday comes to us with words of unapologetic optimism. Gaudete! Rejoice! "Rejoice in the Lord always," the epistle tells us today, "I shall say it again: rejoice!" The real question before us today is "Are you ready to be joyful?"

Rejoicing isn't always easy this time of year, not only because of the pressure to get everything done, but because the sorrows and disappointments of life are felt deeper during these days. Rejoicing does not imply happiness or contentment with life. The joyful message of this Sunday is founded in the truth that the source of our redemption and our hope is near, not just in the proximity of the annual celebration of the incarnation, but in the everyday mystery of the Lord's presence.

Paul's Letter to the Philippians is often referred to as his "letter of joy." One of the ironies of this designation is that Paul composed this letter from prison, quite possibly from his final imprisonment in Rome. In today's reading, Paul speaks of the importance for Christians to "rejoice!" Despite all of Paul's distress and personal persecutions for the faith, he admonishes believers to "have no anxiety at all." Paul remained throughout his thirty-year ministry an apostle to the Gentiles as well as an apostle of "Advent." He waited in the spirit of hope and expectation for the return of Christ. Like John the Baptist, Paul served the Lord and answered his call to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to all those waiting to experience the presence of God in their lives.

We, too, say, "REJOICE!" today, not because we overlook the work to be done or are oblivious to sorrow and tragedy. We rejoice, because as people of faith, we profess the words of our responsorial psalm every day of our lives.

God indeed is my savior; I am confident and unafraid. My strength and my courage is the LORD, and he has been my savior.

We rejoice because in sending his Son among us, God is and will be the reason for our joy and hope.

WELCOME SARAH HART – I am grateful that we are experiencing the joyful faith of Sarah this weekend. The Saturday night concert is followed by her presence throughout the weekend as well as the Evening of Recollection on Monday. I strongly invite everyone to join Sarah in prayer and song on Monday evening. Each of us needs a night like Monday amidst our busy days and ongoing concerns. The night begins at 6:00 pm and will conclude with mass at 7:30 pm.

WEDNESDAY HOLY HOUR – Using a popular social media term, Pope Frances has referred to our Blessed Mother as an influencer. "She took the risk, and for this reason she is strong, she is an 'influencer', the 'influencer' of God. Her 'yes' and her desire to serve were stronger than any doubts or difficulties." I will offer a reflection on that theme at our parish Holy Hour on Wednesday. Stephanie Muhs will lead praise and worship music during the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Please join us Wednesday at 7:30 pm.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION – In addition to our regular schedule, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered in the church from 7:00 to 9:00 pm on Monday, December 20.

COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS — Our continued policy and expectation here at St. Rose is that anyone who is not fully vaccinated against the virus *must wear a face mask covering over the nose and mouth.* In abundance of caution during this time of increasing infections, even among the vaccinated, it is important that we adhere to this policy. Meaning & Symbolism of Poinsettias

What is the meaning of poinsettias? Also known as the Christmas Star and Christmas Flower, it's said that poinsettias' association with Christmas comes from a Mexican legend. The story goes that a child, with no means for a grander gift, gathered humble weeds from the side of the road to place at the church altar on Christmas Eve. As the congregation witnessed a Christmas miracle, the weeds turned into brilliant red and green flowers.

The shape of the poinsettia flower and leaves are sometimes thought of as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus. The red-colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ. The white leaves represent his purity.






Happenings at the Family Mass!


