### ...from Fr. Gerard

And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

MERRY CHRISTMAS - It is with joy and hope in the newborn king that I share with you the good news of Christmas day. How good it is for us to be together as a parish family, along with relatives and friends who join us today. I am happy as well to welcome home college students and those who serve in the military. The family is truly present in the manger, in our church and in our homes.

In our gatherings, we are also aware of those who are not with us. The deceased, the infirmed and all those we are separated from due to physical and emotional distances; they, too, are very much in our minds and hearts today. Despite a desire to have a "perfect" Christmas, the limitations of humanity sometime keep this from being so. With hope, we rejoice that it is into such imperfection that Christ was born. St. John's gospel proclamation that, "the Word became flesh" reminds us that it was into the earthly human experience that the Father willingly sends the Son.

Several years ago, while in Bethlehem on a Holy Land pilgrimage, I was blessed with an insight that remains with me. We want Christmas, and all the world for that matter, to be free of chaos and discord. Unfortunately, this is not the reality that many experience. On pilgrimage, our group looked forward to visiting the location of Christ's birth. We expected Bethlehem to be a place of humility, holiness, and welcome. What we experienced, however, were cars, crowds, noise, and anxiety. It was unnerving. We did, nevertheless, make it to the grotto marking the birthplace of Jesus. Before departing that sacred space, we sang Silent Night together. In doing so, we realized that the madness which had besieged us had dissipated. The Bethlehem we hoped for did, in fact, exist in our desire to encounter Jesus, who is incarnate in the turmoil of humanity.

My prayer is that this may be true in each of your lives. That the Bethlehem as you know it, and the Christmas that you desire, be so through your genuine faith. If we act as humble servants to the people of our lives, if we welcome all as Christ and if we seek holiness through word, deed, and sacrament, we will know the Word made flesh and the Christmas that he desires for us.

CHRISTMAS DAY ON THE LORD'S DAY - With the celebration of this Christmas on Sunday, I am mindful that every Sunday provides us with a Bethlehem experience. Like the shepherds of the field on that blessed night, we come together in our parish church to "see" what the Lord has made known to us. Our celebration of the Eucharist is always the summit of our week in which we come to taste and see the living and real presence of Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is also the source of his abiding presence in our lives. We come to church this day and every Sunday so that we can not only encounter our Lord here in church, but bring that presence into the world. What we celebrate today is that our God is always with us, even in disordered and unsettled times.

We are grateful to celebrate our faith with so many on this special Sunday, and we hope that many will continue to seek him in the days ahead.

THANK YOU - St. Luke tells us that in reaction to the arrival of the shepherds, "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." It is with sentiment that I reflect on the generosity of heart that I have witnessed over the weeks of Advent. Thank you to all who participated in the Outreach Blessing bags as well as the Advent Angels and CYO Christmas Gift Giving programs. The recipients of our own community and beyond are very grateful. In a special way, I thank the Family Mass Committee, CYO Coordinator Lucy Weyer, Outreach Co-Coordinators Ann Hedgis, Sister Carol Radosti and all the volunteers whose dedicated efforts made the distribution of your generosity possible.

I also thank all who have helped us to worship well this Christmas. We are blessed with dedicated staff and volunteers who have prepared the church for the Christmas liturgies. Thank you to John Buckel and all of the Music Ministry participants who have provided us with beautiful Christmas music and throughout the Advent Season. We thank the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, Ushers, and Altar Servers for all of their extra effort, and lastly, I express my gratitude to my brother priests and deacons whose faith and leadership cultivate the mission of the church so well. To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

In union with our Holy Father Pope Francis, and in a non-judgmental spirit of mercy, humility and charity, I invite everyone who will be present at our Christmas Masses, or watching our Christmas Masses via the Catholic Faith Network or CBS, or not present at all: If your life has been far from the Catholic Mass and the Eucharist, I invite you with Pope Francis to return.

I invite you to experience the power and liberation of Christ's mercy and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and to cross the bridge into the full practice of your Catholic Faith through a radical fidelity to the Sunday Mass and an ever-deepening love for the Holy Eucharist.

Perhaps you are not a Catholic and yet have some mysterious attraction to the Catholic Mass and the Eucharist.

You are not alone! Many saints – I think of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the pioneering American Catholic educator and convert – had the same experience and were drawn to enter the Church through their intuitive experience of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist in our parish churches! Be open to the Eucharistic movement of the Holy Spirit in your life!

Our celebration of Christmas 2022 occurs this year as every Catholic diocese, every Catholic parish, every Catholic hospital, university, and institution in the United States is engaged in an evangelizing *Eucharistic Revival*.

What do we mean by the phrase "Eucharistic Revival" and why is it so important for our celebration of Christmas?

What does a love for the Eucharist and an openness to being a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Eucharistic missionary have to do with our celebration of Christmas 2022?

Pope Francis points out the relationship between the Birth of Christ and the Holy Eucharist and the Mass. The very word Bethlehem means "house of Bread."

Pope Francis states: "Bethlehem is the turning point that alters the course of history. There God, in the *house of bread*, is born in a *manger*. It is as if he wanted to say: 'Here I am, as your food.' He does not take, but gives us to eat; he does not give us a mere thing, but his very self. In Bethlehem, we discover that God does not take life, but gives it. To us, who from birth are used to taking and eating, Jesus begins to say: 'Take and eat. This is my body.' (Matthew 26:26) The tiny body of the Child of Bethlehem speaks to us of a new way to live our lives: not by devouring and hoarding, but by sharing and giving. God makes himself small so that he can be our food. By feeding on him, the bread of life,

we can be *reborn in love*, and break the spiral of grasping and greed. From the 'house of bread,' Jesus brings us back home, so that we can become God's family, brothers and sisters to our neighbors. Standing before the manger, we understand that the food of life is not material riches but love, not gluttony but charity, not ostentation but simplicity. The Lord knows that we need to be fed daily. That is why he offered himself to us every day of his life: from the manger in Bethlehem to the Upper Room in Jerusalem. Today too, on the altar, he becomes bread broken for us; he knocks at our door, to enter and eat with us (cf. Revelation 3:20). At Christmas, we on earth receive Jesus, the bread from heaven. It is a bread that never grows stale, but enables us even now to have a foretaste of eternal life."

Eucharistic Revival, in the words of Pope St. John Paul II, is a rediscovery of "Eucharistic Amazement" and Eucharistic Devotion.

Eucharistic Revival means that we understand deeply that every Mass has a cosmic significance, and every Mass is celebrated on the Altar of the world – the Altar of Ukraine and every war torn and injustice-ridden area of our world.

Eucharistic Revival is an effective catechesis of the theology and spirituality of the Catholic Mass that moves the hearts, minds, souls and imaginations of the People of God.

Eucharistic Revival in our Catholic schools means the cultivation of a radical fidelity to the Sunday Catholic Mass on the part of our teachers, our staff and our families.

Eucharistic Revival is a rekindling of Pope Benedict XVI's insight that every period of Church reform and effective Catholic evangelization and mission throughout history can be traced to a rediscovery of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist.<sup>2</sup>

As we celebrate the birth of Christ and his rebirth in our hearts and families at Christmas, we pray for a renewal of our faith in Christ's Eucharistic presence.

We pray that each of us could be Divine Mercy instruments of bringing many, many people back to a full fidelity to the Eucharist and the Catholic Mass.

As we celebrate Christmas, we are being called to be intentional, compassionate, understanding and listening Eucharistic missionaries.

Merry Christmas to you and your families! May the love of the Christ child and the love of the Holy Family light your remaining steps on earth and light your path to Heaven and Eternal Life.

# THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

As the familiar 18th century English Christmas carol reminds us, the Christmas Season, also known as Christmastide, extends far longer than just the day of Christmas. In the Church year, Christmas day is the first of the 12 days of Christmas. The last night, twelfth night, is January 5, the eve of the feast of the Epiphany, celebrated on January 6. Today, the final Sunday of the Christmas Season celebrates the Baptism of Jesus. Clearly, Christmas is meant to be not just a celebration of the baby Jesus or Jesus' birthday but a summary of our lives in relation to God's intimate, incarnate presence with us today.

In the early Eastern Church, the Epiphany was the primary celebration of both Jesus' birth and his manifestation to the world. It was associated with the winter solstice when the sun's light began to be renewed for another year. In the Roman West in the 3rd century, the celebration of Jesus' birth was shifted to December 25 to compete with the pagan festival of the "unconquered sun" (natalis solis invicti) and the time until Epiphany became the Christmas Season.

From the 4th century on, Christmas, with its focus on Christ's incarnation as a truly human person like ourselves, grew in popularity until today it often surpasses Easter in the popular imagination. During this blessed season, then, we are constantly reminded of God's love and desire to be with us and for us to share in the divine life.



### Traditions of the Christmas Season

#### The Christmas Crib

St. Francis of Assisi first popularized the custom of making a Christmas crib or crèche to represent the nativity in 1223 when he said Christmas Mass in a cave with a hay-filled manger and a live ox and ass.

#### The Christmas Tree

Though Christmas trees play no part in scripture and have only in the last few centuries found their way into the Christian celebration of Christmas, they are sacred signs of God's life-giving presence among us and their lights remind us of Christ, "the Light of the world" (Jn 8:12).

#### **Christmas Carols**

Popular songs called carols (Greek *choros*, a sung dance) celebrate the events of the Season. The oldest known carol is "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" from the 12th century. Another popular English carol, "The 12 Days of Christmas" (1780), enumerates a series of daily gifts that total 364—a gift for every day until next Christmas!

### ACTIVITIES FOLLOWING CHRISTMAS DAY

In our society, much of the celebration of Christmas comes before December 25. For Christians, the days after Christmas provide a period of calm in which the spiritual meaning of the manifestation of Jesus, God-With-Us can be explored. The following activities help us appreciate the meaning of the Incarnation as the new year arrives.

- Take some time to look back upon the previous year and identify your personal "joyful mysteries," moments when God was especially present to you. Express your gratitude to God for these moments and your hope that you will experience more fully the presence of God in the new year.
- The slower pace of activity after December 25 makes this a good time for visiting with family and friends during these days. Reflect on how God is revealed to you especially in your relationships.
- Spend some time in silent prayer before the crib, the Christmas tree or in church. Invite God to touch your heart at the wonder of the Incarnation.

# THE COMPANIONS OF CHRIST

Over the centuries as the Christmas Season was celebrated, the Church gradually drew together a series of feasts following Christmas Day that by the Middle Ages were often referred to as the "Companions of Christ" (*Comites Christi*), a kind of royal entourage to accompany the newborn king. In their various ways, they represent different forms of witness to Christ or some aspect of our Christian faith.

**December 26:** St. Stephen, the first martyr, who was filled with the Holy Spirit and proclaimed that salvation came through Christ and was stoned by an angry Jewish (Acts 6:8-8:1).

**December 27:** St. John, apostle & evangelist, who followed Christ during his earthly ministry and then wrote his Gospel to reveal the meaning of Christ's words and actions (Mt 4:18-21, Jn 21:24-25).

**December 28:** The Holy Innocents were the children who were murdered by King Herod the Great in his attempt to eliminate Jesus as a threat to his royal power (Mt 2:16-18).

**December 29:** St. Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury and head of the English Church, who was murdered by King Henry II's knights for opposing the king's attempts to control the Church.

**December 30:** The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph who show how our own families might reflect a right relationship to God and one another.

**December 31:** Pope St. Sylvester, who oversaw the transition of the church from an illegal to a legal religion under Roman emperor Constantine and invited the world's bishops to the first Ecumenical Council at Nicea (325).

**January 1:** (the Octave Day of Christmas): Mary the Mother of God, whose "yes" to God models our willingness to bring Jesus to birth in ourselves and our world (Lk 1:26-38).

**January 8:** the Epiphany, when God in the incarnate child Jesus is revealed to the all the world in the persons of the Gentile Magi (Mt. 2:1-12).

**January 9:** The Baptism of the Lord. This feast now ends the Christmas Season by celebrating Jesus' commitment to God's saving activity and God's commissioning him with the power of the Holy Spirit to accomplish it.









# IRA Charitable Rollover Qualified Charitable Distribution

If you would like to make a gift to St. Rose using your IRA, you can if:

- On the date you make the gift, you are at least:
  - 70 1/2 years old if you reached 70 1/2 prior to 2020; or
  - 72 years old, pursuant to the Secure Act which changed the RMD age from 70 ½ to 72,
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify), and
- You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions.

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of Federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

This is a unique opportunity to make a charitable contribution through a direct IRA transfer while reducing your adjusted gross income.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases, you will only have to fill out a simple form.

<u>VERY IMPORTANT</u>: Your gift must go directly from your IRA to our Parish. If you receive the money first, you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.




