

...from Fr. Gerard

In this you rejoice, although now for a little while, you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

This year, the dates of Lent and Easter matched closely to the same dates three years ago. So, too, do the readings we have read during these weeks. I have, therefore, been reflecting on those weeks of quarantine at the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic. When I see pictures from that time or read things that I or others wrote, I am taken by how much we had hope. On Easter Sunday 2020, we rejoiced in the resurrection, yet at the same time, we were immersed in the pain and suffering of the pandemic. We learned that joy and suffering were not mutually exclusive. In fact, we came to understand that suffering gives a deeper appreciation of true joy.

At a prayer service for the sick and suffering, Pope Saint John Paul II reflected on the words of Saint Peter in today's second reading in this way.

"As we are told in the First Letter of Peter, we may be called to experience suffering in our lives, but only through a faith which is tested shall we obtain the salvation of our souls. The only way to share in Christ's glorious victory over sin and death is by being united with him in his Passion. It is Jesus' Death and Resurrection which show us the meaning of human suffering. Believers who suffer in union with Christ and surrender themselves to him help make his salvation known to others.

Jesus' Passion and Crucifixion is not a stumbling block for you, but a source of joy and hope. Accepting your suffering in this way, you allow others to see the true dignity of the human person. You reveal a God who loves us so much that he became one of us in order to share our pain and sorrows. You make known the truth that God will transform death itself into a beautiful future where he will wipe away every tear from our eyes."

With our church filled to capacity and beyond this Easter, I wondered if we were seeing a resurgence in the practice of faith. I hope that we are. I believe that there continues to be a longing for resurrection. When we experience dark and hopeless moments or times of abandonment, my prayer is that we will remember this transition of these three years and find joy in rising from darkness to light.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her diary.

St. Faustina's Diary records Jesus' request that a Feast of Mercy be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy was also given to St. Faustina and, in addition, Jesus gave St. Faustina nine intentions for which to pray the Chaplet beginning on Good Friday and ending on Easter Saturday. I invite you to join us this Sunday at 3:00 for our annual Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour as we mark the end of the days of novena.

While the acute stages of the pandemic have ended, many are still troubled by its effects and their own vulnerability. In addition, other challenges to health and well-being remain burdensome in many lives. On this Divine Mercy Sunday, I ask you to continue to pray for the sick and to let us know of those who are afflicted, so we may remember them in prayer. I also ask you to sincerely pray for those who have shouldered much of the sorrow and anxieties of these days, our health care and emergency personnel.

EASTER THANK YOU'S – In last week's column, I briefly expressed my thanks to those who shared in the ministries of Holy Week. I want to thank our parish staff and the various volunteers who worked so hard behind the scenes to allow us to celebrate Holy Week so well. I also wish to acknowledge the faithful participation of all of you. The beauty of these liturgies was most evident in the faith professed by those whose prayer and worship unified us. I also thank you for your financial generosity which enables us to continue the good work of our parish.



How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?



For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2. If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass.)

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book:</u> A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.






