

He summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority.

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus was moved by the needs of the people whom he saw as troubled and abandoned. He identifies them as sheep without a shepherd. Who will shepherd them? In John's Gospel, Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd, but here he does not act as that shepherd. Instead, he calls together the twelve and obliges them to be shepherds.

Today, the Lord continues to look upon the sheep without shepherds. He sees those who suffer troubles and feel abandoned because not enough is being done to help them. He sees parishes without priests to serve them. He sees ministries in the church that rely on a few to meet the needs of many. He sees a lack of true leadership in a society plagued by narcissism. We, too, see these things, and we do as Jesus tells us to do: We beg the master of the harvest to send forth more laborers. And Jesus taps us on the shoulder and says, "YOU do it."

We must pray for and ask God to increase the number of priest vocations, because there are too few being ordained. Last Sunday, we were blessed with the presence of Fr. Patrick Nolan, SJ, a St. Rose of Lima parishioner ordained for the Jesuit community in 2018. Prior to him, I believe the last parishioner to be ordained was Fr. Michael Reid, ordained over 50 years ago. In a parish as large as ours, we know that there is a potentially abundant harvest of vocations. We all need to plant the seeds of priestly vocations as well as those of religious life. We pray for priestly laborers, and we work to foster them through our prayer and our actively encouraging our young to discern God's call.

With that being said, we also need to acknowledge that the work of shepherding is not just for the ordained and religiously professed. In its Dogmatic Constitution of the Church, the Second Vatican Council states:

"The priesthood of the laity is based on the fact that all those baptized receive not only sanctifying grace, but also a character, or indelible mark, in their souls by which they are conformed to Christ as priest, prophet and king. Vatican II reminded Catholics that all the faithful are truly priests through baptism, but their priesthood differs from the ministerial priesthood in its essence and not only in degree." [LG 10]

The laity share in the shepherding of the church. All Catholics who have received the sacraments of initiation, (particularly baptism), participate in the one priesthood of Christ. There are two complementary priesthoods in the Church: the ministerial (ordained) priesthood and the lay priesthood. The ministerial priesthood is responsible for administering the sacraments and, in particular, consecrating the Eucharist. The lay priesthood is responsible for taking up that sacramental grace and consecrating the world to Christ. Parallel to a crisis of limited vocations in the ministerial priesthood is a crisis in the response to the call to the vocation of the priesthood of the laity. Jesus responds to their needs through us — and, too few recognize their role as shepherds. Let us pray that each of us will have the courage to respond as shepherds, using our gifts to serve the sheep who long for a shepherd.

ACTION ALERT - The New York State Legislature is presently considering so-called, medical-aid in dying bills - aka assisted suicide, aka doctor-prescribed suicide (DPS).

Bill S.2445-A-Hoylman-Sigal/A.995-A-Paulin would reverse New York's long-standing ban on assisted suicide, allowing physicians to prescribe lethal drugs to certain terminally ill adults that request them. Preventing this bill from becoming law should be a top priority for all New Yorkers. Activists are trying to make a late surge for this legislation.

Assisted suicide represents a complete relinquishment of our moral responsibility to persons who are suffering from terminal illnesses. Instead of showing sensitivity and compassion by caring for such people, the sponsors of these bills would have us simply hasten their demise. The state of New York can and must do better. Please act immediately, and contact your representative in the NYS Assembly, Michael Durso or John Mikulin, as well as State Senator Alexis Weik, and urge them to oppose this bill.



How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book:</u> A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>Prayer Line Ministry</u>: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.
