...from Fr. Gerard

I pray to you, O LORD, for the time of your favor, O God! In your great kindness, answer me with your constant help.

Why do we find ourselves full of anxiety, frustration, and sadness in the face of life's difficulties and challenges? For one simple reason: the truth of God's providence hasn't made its way from our head to our heart. We believe in God's providence in the abstract, but we don't apply that belief to the concrete reality of our daily lives. There is only one way to bring this truth from the head to the heart: prayer.

We must pray more and pray better - all of us. Prayer must become as important for us as eating and sleeping. Back in 2008, in an Apostolic Journey to the United States, Pope Benedict XVI led a prayer service for young people at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers. I was privileged to be there with students from Holy Trinity Diocesan High School. Pope Benedict skillfully referred to local saints and their dependence on prayer:

"What matters most is that you develop your personal relationship with God. That relationship is expressed in prayer. God, by his very nature, speaks, hears, and replies. Indeed, Saint Paul reminds us: we can and should 'pray constantly' (1 Thess 5:17). Far from turning in on ourselves or withdrawing from the ups and downs of life, by praying, we turn toward God and through him to each other, including the marginalized and those following ways other than God's path (cf. Spe Salvi, 33). As the saints teach us so vividly, prayer becomes hope in action. Christ was their constant companion, with whom they conversed at every step of their journey for others."

As summer vacations are beginning, I urge you to take advantage of our extra time to revitalize your prayer life. It's the surest way to let the power of God's providence bring us the inner wisdom, stability, and balance that he longs to give us.

STABLE STEWARDSHIP – A challenge of the summer days is that they are the final months of the parish's fiscal year, and Sunday offertory contributions begin to waiver as vacation schedules impact church attendance. Currently, we are slightly below what we budgeted as income from the Sunday offertory. First and foremost, thank you for your generous support throughout the year. Secondly, I ask you to anticipate your time away from the parish and continue to make your contributions either at the masses you attend or via our electronic giving format.

CONGRATULATIONS - Please join me in congratulating the graduates of Saint Rose of Lima School, Catholic High Schools, and Massapequa Public Schools. They have achieved much, and we pray for them as they take the next steps of their lives.

WEEK OF ADORATION RETURNS – During the first week of Easter, we hosted extended hours of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Father Graham Center Chapel. That week was a tremendous success in terms of participation and spiritual fruit. Believe it or not, our Sunday mass attendance has increased since last year. I believe that the week of prayer was a significant cause of the rise in Sunday mass attendance. At the end of this month, we will hold another week of extended adoration. Please join us June 26 to June 30. Please see further information elsewhere in today's bulletin.




