

...from Fr. Gerard

"LAUDATO SÍ, mí Signore" - "Praise be to you, my Lord." These are the words that open Pope Francis' encyclical on ecology and care for God's creation. These words, quoting St. Francis of Assisi's beautiful canticle, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. When Pope Francis released this encyclical in June 2015, he invited all Catholics and people of goodwill to commit to protecting families and future generations through action to care for our common home.

The debate about climate change continues to be a part of national and global dialogue, especially in response to extreme weather events. Rather than sink further into partisan divisiveness, let us reflect on themes that Pope Francis highlighted in **Laudato Sí**, and discern how we are being called to respond.

- A Moral and Spiritual Challenge. The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- Care for God's Creation. God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation
- We are All Connected. We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the related world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.
- Impact on the Poor. People in poverty have contributed least to climate change, yet they are disproportionately impacted by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resources by wealthy nations, those who are poor experience pollution, lack of access to clean water, hunger and more.
- Called to Solidarity. We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewal resources, and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways.
- **Technological and Economic Development.** It must serve human beings and enhance human dignity instead of creating an economy of exclusion, so that all people have access to what is needed for authentic human development.
- **Supporting Life, Protecting Creation.** Concern for nature is incompatible with failure to protect vulnerable human beings such as unborn children, people with disabilities, or victims of human trafficking.
- A Time to Act. Pope Francis calls for a change in lifestyle and consumption. We can make important changes as individuals, families, and communities, and as civil and political leaders.
- **Hope and Joy.** "Injustice is not invincible" (no. 74), and we act knowing that we seek to live out God's vision of renewed relationships with God, ourselves, one another and creation.

How You Can Respond

Each of us is called to take concrete steps - from reducing consumption to working for political change - to better care for creation. Here are some ideas:

- 1. Become more aware of our connectedness. Care for one another and for creation includes understanding that "everything is connected" (no. 91), and that the economy, politics, community involvement, and technology all affect the future of the planet and mankind. How can we become more aware of our connectedness?
- 2. Changes to lifestyle and consumption habits can make a big difference. For example, get a re-usable water bottle, take shorter showers, walk, bike or take public transportation instead of driving, recycle, compost food waste, and buy energy-efficient appliances.
- 3. Make changes institutionally at your parish, school or workplace, For example, start recycling and composting, use washable dinnerware in cafeterias, share electronically instead of printing, do an energy audit, and install solar panels.
- 4. Support local efforts to solve environmental problems. Community groups around the country are working to make city, county and state-wide changes that can make a big difference. Find out what is going on locally, and get involved.

Helping Haiti

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to Haiti in the past with either prayers or some material contributions. Everything has been put to good use.

We are once again renewing the efforts to help the people of this island. Many of the items needed are much the same as previous years, e.g., shoes, sneakers and sandals are in demand for all age groups. Please rubber band the pairs together. Also needed is light-weight clothing for both adults and children.

Some of the medical donations needed are OTC medicine such as aspirin, ibuprofen, non-gel vitamins, multi-vitamins and antiseptic soaps. Dial soap is cut into four sections and given to four people.

Also appreciated would be donations of food such as rice and tuna fish.

The drop-off point is the Advent Shop at 3 Bayview Avenue in Massapequa. It is open from 10:00 am-6:00 pm, Monday through Saturday. Thank you to Sara, the proprietor, as well as the wonderful staff for their help. And thank you, Fr. Gerard and the residents and parishioners of St. Rose. Helping Haiti has made a difference, and it is only because of the big support by you.

2024 WEEKDAY MASS INTENTION BOOK

The 2024 MASS INTENTION BOOK FOR WEEKDAY MASSES (not Sunday Masses) will open on WEDNESDAY, JULY 26 (earlier than previous years) at 9:00 AM in the Fr. Graham Meeting Room.

THE GUIDELINES ARE LISTED BELOW. PLEASE TAKE A FEW MOMENTS TO CAREFULLY REVIEW THEM.

- 1. Only one family name per intention may be listed.
- 2. Masses must be requested in person and not by phone.
- 3. No more than eight masses may be requested by any one family on the day the book is opened.
- 4. *No more than one mass in any particular week* may be offered for the *same intention*, even when different people make the same request.
- 5. If you are requesting masses for someone who is unable to come in person, you will be permitted to request *only two masses for them instead of the maximum of eight masses*.
- 6. Collective or multiple mass intentions are available at the Saturday 8:00 am liturgy and the Sunday 8:00 am liturgy. Collective or multiple mass intentions do not replace all regularly scheduled masses with announced intentions, but assist people in arranging for a mass intention sooner than normally possible. According to diocesan directives, the following requirements must be met with reference to collective or multiple intention masses:
 - (a) The intentions are remembered at one mass by one priest;
 - (b) Those who arrange for the intentions must agree beforehand and freely to have their intention remembered with other intentions;
 - (c) The collective or multiple intention mass may not occur more than twice a week;
 - (d) The usual offering of \$20 may be asked for each intention.
- 7. We will open the Sunday mass intentions for any given month on the first business day of the preceding month at 9:00 am when the Rectory opens.

What is 'Remembering Loved Ones'? Many parishioners use Remembering Loved Ones to remember or honor a loved one in a special way. A monetary donation, ranging from \$30 to \$125, is used to cover the cost of various items used at our Liturgies for a period of one week, usually made in memory of a loved one, or to celebrate a special occasion. An acknowledgement of your offering appears in the bulletin, and an attractive certificate is prepared for you to give as a keepsake if requested.




The Ministry of Ushers and Greeters ~ A Ministry of Hospitality


