

#### ...from Fr. Gerard

Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me.

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus emphasizes the importance of keeping our eyes on him and always making him our top priority. Nothing else matters as much as our relationship with God. This means following Jesus wherever he leads, doing everything his way, all the way, every day, with no excuses for being mediocre in our faith, laying down our lives in service to others like he did.

Laying down our lives means making sacrifices, such as giving our cup of cold water to someone who's thirsty. It means receiving someone into our busy schedules and listening for the prophet in him; e.g., what is God saying to us through this person?

When we refuse to lay down our lives for others, we reject the Cross of Christ and his sufferings, which he submitted to for our sake. This does not mean, however, that we can never say no to others. Jesus wants to lead us away from the harm of abuse or demands that are sinful or the enabling of unhealthy behaviors. Saying no in such cases is yet another Way of the Cross.

When we truly follow Christ, we can receive all that he is and all that he has for us. When we let go of our fears and personal goals, letting Jesus lead us into new places and new ways of handling problems, we discover new life in Christ. His ways are always far better than what we had feared would happen.

This is the difference between a mediocre faith and a life in Christ that is full of adventures, miracles, surprising solutions, healing, victories, and realizing how very precious and important we are to God.

A FAITHFUL SUMMER – I came across an article this week that I encourage you to read. Summer provides a break from the routine, and, therefore, an opportunity to engage our faith in new ways. The article is entitled 7 Ways to Bring Your Faith Into Summer As Schedules Change and can be found here, <a href="https://tinyurl.com/A-Faithful-Summer">https://tinyurl.com/A-Faithful-Summer</a>. One of the suggestions addresses Sunday Mass. Instead of telling yourself, "We have to go to Mass on vacation," think, "We get to check out a cool new church in a place we've never been to before!" If you're planning any summer travel, plan for Mass on vacation. The website (and app) MassTimes.org is a great source for planning Mass ahead of time.

**SUMMER VISITING PRIESTS** - We are happy to once again welcome "home" Fr. Joe McCann, CM. Throughout the last 40 years St. Rose has been blessed to have Fr. Joe as a Sunday visitor. FOR WEEKDAY MASSES (not Sunday Masses)
will open on WEDNESDAY, JULY 26 (earlier than previous years)
at 9:00 AM in the Fr. Graham Meeting Room.

# THE GUIDELINES ARE LISTED BELOW. PLEASE TAKE A FEW MOMENTS TO CAREFULLY REVIEW THEM.

- 1. Only one family name per intention may be listed.
- 2. Masses must be requested in person and not by phone.
- 3. No more than eight masses may be requested by any one family on the day the book is opened.
- 4. *No more than one mass in any particular week* may be offered for the *same intention*, even when different people make the same request.
- 5. If you are requesting masses for someone who is unable to come in person, you will be permitted to request *only two masses for them instead of the maximum of eight masses*.
- 6. Collective or multiple mass intentions are available at the Saturday 8:00 am liturgy and the Sunday 8:00 am liturgy. Collective or multiple mass intentions do not replace all regularly scheduled masses with announced intentions, but assist people in arranging for a mass intention sooner than normally possible. According to diocesan directives, the following requirements must be met with reference to collective or multiple intention masses:
  - (a) The intentions are remembered at one mass by one priest;
  - (b) Those who arrange for the intentions must agree beforehand and freely to have their intention remembered with other intentions;
  - (c) The collective or multiple intention mass may not occur more than twice a week;
  - (d) The usual offering of \$20 may be asked for each intention.
- 7. We will open the Sunday mass intentions for any given month on the first business day of the preceding month at 9:00 am when the Rectory opens.

# How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book:</u> A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

**<u>Prayer Line Ministry</u>**: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

**For the Military**: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.
