e sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in faith. 1 Peter 5:8-9a

Dear St. Rose of Lima Parishioners,

In my capacity as National Chaplain, I have spent the last week in West Virginia working at the Boy Scouts of America National Jamboree. In my everyday encounters with people from around the country, the question of where I am from often comes up. I usually respond with Long Island, NY. Sometimes I am asked a follow-up question, asking me to identify where on Long Island, and when I say Massapequa, many recognize the name and its connection to recent national headlines involving the apprehension of a suspect in a notorious crime. While these interactions cause a temporary moment of uncomfortability, I can't help but imagine the ongoing impact this situation has had on a neighborhood besieged with investigators, media and inquiring strangers.

More importantly, I am deeply concerned for those who are experiencing the shock and fearful realization of what is alleged to have happened in their midst. The above quotation from St. Peter's first letter captures the realization that evil and its devastation is always in our midst, without us being aware of its presence. This is not a consoling realization; in fact, it can cripple us with fear. This situation also evokes a righteous anger, toward responsible individuals and even to God, for allowing such horrifying things to happen.

St. Peter does not simply provide a sobering wake-up call; he also evokes hope. No matter the darkness and devastating effects of evil, by God's grace, we can resist and overcome it through faith. No evil is more powerful than the power of the resurrection itself. We are a resurrection people who have been given a savior; therefore, no evil defines us or has power over us.

Regarding this situation, we may also question how we can resist what we cannot see. Here we are called first and foremost to personal responsibility. An evil like this begins within the human person. The use of pornography continues to increase exponentially due in great part to its digital accessibility. Feeding such an addiction desensitizes its user to the dignity of the human person and causes a thirst for something more. In addition, prostitution and so-called sex work is not victimless as some may purport. Resisting these temptations, by the grace of God and the sacrament of reconciliation, is crucial to overcoming such evils.

One of the suggested reasons for the delayed resolution to these crimes is that perhaps not enough attention was paid due to the lifestyle of the victims. While I believe it would be unfair to say there was a conscious bias by law enforcement, I do believe that the urgency to solve these crimes was not there among the public. Justice and dignity are due to every person, no matter their state in life. Communal passivity does turn the heat down on resolving crimes that have been inflicted on the poor and marginalized. This, too, is something we must resist.

Throughout the week here, I have prayed for and with our young people. They grow up in a deprayed world. Yet they offer great hope. Among the young people I have encountered here, I find great hope. They are polite, service-minded and desire to make a difference in the world they inherit. Not only do we need to continue to pray for them, but provide them with opportunities like scouting, sports, faith formation and opportunities for service. This is the greatest way for us to resist the devil in our midst.

I have felt called to offer some public response to this situation, but have been reluctant to do so. I did not want to exploit or further sensationalize the situation. I am also sensitive to the fact that this situation has impacted people in various ways, including relatives of victims and the accused who have connections with this parish. I hope what I have offered in these words does provide some consolation and guidance. I also want to reach out to those who are intimately affected by this unspeakable offense against humanity. I have considered visiting with neighbors but don't know how to do that on my own initiative without appearing to add to the sensationalism. I, therefore, ask for your help and guidance. If you know or are someone who needs to talk about this horror or would like to come together with others in the context of prayer, please contact me. Evil has the power to divide, but it also empowers a desire to unite in the most difficult moments. Let us pray that by the grace of God and the unity of us, the body of Christ, we may be vigilant and resistant to that which harms us. Let us pray, too, for all the victims and their families who mourn them.



How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book</u>: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you an write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>Prayer Line Ministry:</u> Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

<u>For the Military</u>: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.

What is 'Remembering Loved Ones'? Many parishioners use Remembering Loved Ones to remember or honor a loved one in a special way.
