#### ...from Fr. Gerard

For this command that I enjoin on you today...it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out.

I don't think I have ever met a parent that hasn't caught themselves sounding like their mother or father. Amid reprimanding a child or offering words of wisdom, they hear the words of their parents rolling off their tongues without any thought. Very often, these are the same people who took their first child home from the hospital in somewhat disbelief that they were entrusted with this young life. Parenting begins with a great deal of self-doubt, and yet the wisdom and abilities that they were not sure they had come forth without much effort. It is in the same spirit that Moses speaks to the people in the first reading today.

What does it take to be a faithful believer? What does God want from me? What is the right way to live our lives and conduct ourselves in the world? These questions often confound us, or perhaps we don't ask at all for fear of not finding an answer. As Moses tells his followers, and just like the new parent, the wisdom you seek is very near to you — you only need to carry it out.

Jesus, too, tells his disciples, "You know the way," and the prophet Micah famously answered this question with the words, "Act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with your God." Living a life of faith is not as complicated as we make it or fear it to be. Being in the Lord's presence is what is most important. Without us particularly realizing it, the knowledge, wisdom, and courage we need comes forth from us because we spend time with the Lord.

What does it mean to be in the Lord's presence? Certainly, our prayer, spiritual reading and reflecting on the scriptures are all important. What is essential, however, is our participation in the sacramental life. Receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation embraces us in the Lord's mercy. Most importantly is our participation in the Eucharist. A woman once had the "courage" to tell me that she felt that during the summer months, her family needed a break from routine, so like time off from school, *taking time off from church was OK*. It may sound shocking or outrageous to hear such a thing, but that mentality does exist. In giving ourselves permission to take some time off from the practice of our faith, it is perhaps when we most need it. When we are idol, our temptations are more powerful. When we have free time without some of the normal pressures of life, we are freer to be with the Lord.

So, let's take advantage of these summer months, spend time with the Lord, be faithful to mass and let the wisdom and courage of the Lord rest in us, so it is near to us when we most need it.

**FR. ALLAN UPDATE** - Fr. Allan is grateful for all your prayers. He is doing well and recuperating away from the parish and beginning his July vacation.

# The 2024 MASS INTENTION BOOK FOR WEEKDAY MASSES (not Sunday Masses) will open on WEDNESDAY, JULY 26 (earlier than previous years) at 9:00 AM in the Fr. Graham Meeting Room.

# THE GUIDELINES ARE LISTED BELOW. PLEASE TAKE A FEW MOMENTS TO CAREFULLY REVIEW THEM.

- 1. Only one family name per intention may be listed.
- 2. Masses must be requested in person and not by phone.
- 3. No more than eight masses may be requested by any one family on the day the book is opened.
- 4. *No more than one mass in any particular week* may be offered for the *same intention*, even when different people make the same request.
- 5. If you are requesting masses for someone who is unable to come in person, you will be permitted to request *only two masses for them instead of the maximum of eight masses*.
- 6. Collective or multiple mass intentions are available at the Saturday 8:00 am liturgy and the Sunday 8:00 am liturgy. Collective or multiple mass intentions do not replace all regularly scheduled masses with announced intentions, but assist people in arranging for a mass intention sooner than normally possible. According to diocesan directives, the following requirements must be met with reference to collective or multiple intention masses:
  - (a) The intentions are remembered at one mass by one priest;
  - (b) Those who arrange for the intentions must agree beforehand and freely to have their intention remembered with other intentions:
  - (c) The collective or multiple intention mass may not occur more than twice a week;
  - (d) The usual offering of \$20 may be asked for each intention.
- 7. We will open the Sunday mass intentions for any given month on the first business day of the preceding month at 9:00 am when the Rectory opens.

What is 'Remembering Loved Ones'? Many parishioners use Remembering Loved Ones to remember or honor a loved one in a special way. # How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book:</u> A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>Prayer Line Ministry</u>: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

*For the Military*: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.
