...from Fr. Gerard

I have great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart.

This Sunday, we again hear a reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans. This section of the Letter addresses one of the more vexing problems for St. Paul and the early church: how do Jews and Gentiles fit into God's master plan for salvation history? More specifically, how do non-believing Jews fit into God's plan for salvation? Today's reading presents the opening words to Paul's insights into this question. He writes of the "great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart" over his experience of his fellow Jews rejecting Jesus as the Jewish Messiah. Paul even offers to be voluntarily "cut off from Christ," even "accursed," if it means saving his non-believing Jewish brothers.

Why does St. Paul care about the faithfulness of others? Why is he willing to forgo his own salvation so that others may believe? There can be no other answer but love, a love that is initiated by Christ himself who saves Paul from his own disbelief. Known at the time as "Saul," St. Paul was a notorious persecutor of Jesus' followers. He was responsible for the death of the first martyr, St. Stephen, and was on his way to continue his pursuit of those who professed a belief in Christ when he was knocked to the ground and blinded by the resurrected Christ. In the context of human justice, condemnation was due to Saul, the persecutor. It was a continuation of the sacrificial love of the crucified Christ that saved him. St. Paul's passion for the conversion of others reflects that of Christ.

We may have similar feelings about others in our lives. We may even be as passionate for their conversion as St. Paul, willing to sacrifice ourselves for others. How do we do that? The Lord quotes the prophet Hosea when he tells the Pharisees to "Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice." (Matthew 9:13) Jesus is not asking us to sacrifice our relationship with him or our own salvation; he is asking us to be merciful. In a Wednesday audience, Pope Francis spoke about conversion being a fruit of mercy. "If all our Christianity does not lead us to mercy, then we have taken the wrong path because mercy is the only true destination of all spiritual journeys. It is one of the most beautiful fruits of mercy."

Our passion for the conversion and salvation of another ought not to be manifested in aggression toward them, but manifested in the way in which we love and show mercy.

ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY – On Tuesday, August 15, we celebrate the Solemnity of our Blessed Mother's Assumption into heaven, body and soul. This Solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass will be celebrated Monday, August 14 at 4:00 pm, and Tuesday, August 15 at 7:30 and 9:00 am and 7:30 pm.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In the following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However, by the 13th century, there was universal agreement.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him, body and soul, in heaven.



How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

Parish Prayer Intention Book: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you an write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>Prayer Line Ministry:</u> Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.

REMEMBERING LOVED ONES FOR 2024

What is 'Remembering Loved Ones'? Many parishioners use Remembering Loved Ones to remember or honor a loved one in a special way. A monetary donation, ranging from \$30 to \$125, is used to cover the cost of various items used at our Liturgies for a period of one week, usually made in memory of a loved one, or to celebrate a special occasion. An acknowledgement of your offering appears in the bulletin, and an attractive certificate is prepared for you to give as a keepsake if requested.
