

...from Fr. Gerard

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

August 6 is the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord Jesus Christ, which commemorates Jesus' unveiling as the Son of God, and his radical change of appearance while in the presence of Peter, James, and John on a mountaintop. This year the feast falls on a Sunday and we celebrate it today.

The Gospel of Matthew records that Jesus "was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light." At this moment Moses and Elijah appeared, and they were talking with Jesus. Peter, misunderstanding the meaning of this manifestation, offered to make three "booths" (or "dwellings") for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. A bright cloud overshadowed them and a voice from the cloud stated, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

The Transfiguration is a pivotal moment because it revealed Christ's glory prior to the crucifixion, and it anticipated his resurrection and ascension. It also prefigures the glorification of human nature in Christ. Some think that the setting on the mountain is significant because it becomes the point where human nature meets God, with Jesus acting as a point of connection between heaven and earth.

In today's Gospel account, we hear that Peter, James, and John fell prostrate to the ground and they "were very much afraid." Jesus, however, encourages them to arise and "have no fear." When the disciples looked up, they saw only Jesus.

We, too, may respond the same way when we hear God's voice. How many times do you become fearful when invited to participate more fully in the life of the Church? Or, when someone says something negative about the Church, are you afraid to respond? Remember, we too, are beloved sons and daughters of God; Jesus is there to help us, but we need to listen.

The transfiguration of Christ occurs again and again every time we listen to him, and our faith is enlightened. It happens every time we have a breakthrough from blindness to understanding, from sinfulness to holiness, from doubt to trust. However, now we are transfigured with Jesus!

Whenever we let his uncreated light consume the darkness within us, the people around us see Christ's true identity in us. We shine with him. Therefore, it's vitally important that we give Jesus the areas of darkness that still linger within us and let him expose the truth in his light. By repenting (which means we change), we're transformed into our true identity. What is our true identity? It's our innermost being that was created in the image of God. It's our sainthood!

Listen. Can you hear God's voice saying about you what he said about Jesus on Mount Tabor? "This is my beloved child; listen to him/her." He is saying this to others as you do the work to which he's called you. Some folks will hear him, some won't, but our yes to his calling is not based on how many people will heed his voice. We serve God because we have been transfigured. Our holiness impels us to go where we can do the greatest good.

WELCOME ADAM GRAND – This fall we will welcome an addition to our school and parish staff. Adam Grand will be teaching religious education to our 5th through 8th grade students. In addition, he will serve as a campus minister to the school, helping students to be better engaged in their faith outside the classroom. Adam will also be joining our parish youth evangelization team which includes Tom Griffin, who has been working with middle school students and Grace Rozea in our Faith Formation program. Adam will be focused on reaching out to the High School age students of our parish.

Adam will be introducing himself to the parish next month. For now, he is looking for an apartment to rent. If you are aware of an available and affordable apartment or a sublease to be shared, please contact me as soon as possible.






