...from Fr. Gerard

*You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel;
when you hear me say anything, you shall warn them for me.*

As the oldest of five children, I was raised with a sense of responsibility and accountability for my younger siblings. Whether it was specifically stated by my parents or otherwise implied, I knew that I was called to be an example to my brothers and sister, to keep them safe and even to offer correction. I, of course, did not always desire that responsibility and never liked being accused of being bossy. As I grew older, I came to understand that the obligation of responsibility for others was not reserved for oldest siblings, but an accountability I had for all of my brothers and sisters in the human family.

Nobody likes to be corrected; however, fraternal correction has the good of the corrected person in mind. Today's readings remind us that correction, when done with affection, is a great act of charity that we should appreciate and practice for the good of others.

In today's First Reading, the Lord reminds Ezekiel, and us, that it is our moral responsibility to warn a brother or sister that they are doing something evil. We live in a world that teaches us to mind our own business, but that doesn't include someone who is drowning, at the mercy of criminals, or committing a crime themselves. In addition, our society is full of initiatives to help others turn from evil: from programs for "at risk" youth to drug rehab, correctional facilities, and prisons. But none of them has the same power as a brother or sister who genuinely cares and takes an interest in someone on the wrong path. The Lord today is telling Ezekiel, and us, to inform consciences out of charity, not to force them onto the right path. If we love someone, we cannot leave them in ignorance about the evil they're doing.

In today's Second Reading, St. Paul reminds us that every just law is built on love, and if we focus on loving and teaching others to love, everything else will fall into place. Society has many laws and measures today that are built on justice, but not always enforced with love. Deeper than the labels of "suspect," "victim," "criminal," there is only one label that matters: "brother or sister." When asked what the greatest commandment was, our Lord himself answered that, in addition to loving God with our entire heart, mind, and soul, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Fraternal correction is not returning evil for evil, no matter what our brother has done.

Lastly, although we may be eager to go out and start correcting, there is a fine line between judging and correcting. Our Lord taught us to take care of the beam in your eye before you help your brother with the splinter in his. If we're going to inform other peoples' consciences, we need to make sure to form our own. The best remedy to being judgmental is to remember that we are all sinners in need of grace and guidance. With a healthy dose of humility and self-knowledge, you'll be ready to help your brother or sister as brothers and sisters.

BACK TO SCHOOL – The return of students to school this week is a sign of the many new beginnings happening in parish life. Faith Formation, CYO, Scouts, and Family Mass are just some of the ways in which we seek to engage families and youth in the church's mission. I hope that this may also be a time of new beginning for older folks as well. I encourage everyone to consider ways in which they may be engaged in a new mission. In a particular way, I ask you to consider engaging in one of our liturgical ministries - ushers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and music ministry. The celebration of Holy Mass is the source and summit of everything else that we do as a parish. Take some time to discern where God may be calling you to serve.

22nd ANNIVERSARY 9/11/01 – We are compelled to mark the day as an act of love for those who were lost, those who endured the trauma and those who continue to suffer. The number of FDNY members who have died because of 9-11-related illnesses has nearly equaled the number of members lost that day. In remembering what was lost, we are also called to remember the loss of solidarity, respect, and concern for our neighbor in the days, weeks and months that followed that most tragic day. I am so grateful to have the opportunity to participate in the annual ceremony on Monday morning as well as celebrate the memorial mass in the evening at 6:00 pm at 9-11 Towers of Freedom Memorial, John Burns Park. I invite you to join us at these events on Monday. Please note that there will not be a 7:30 pm mass and adoration in the church.

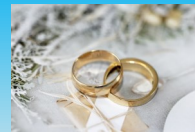

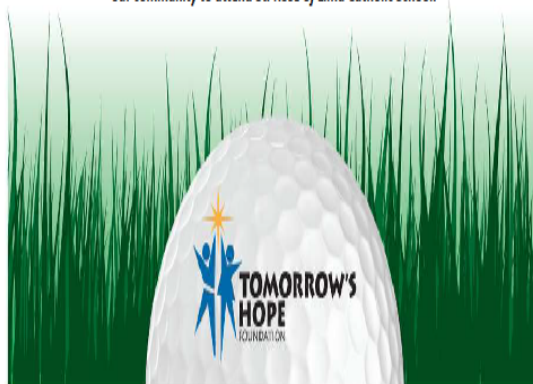

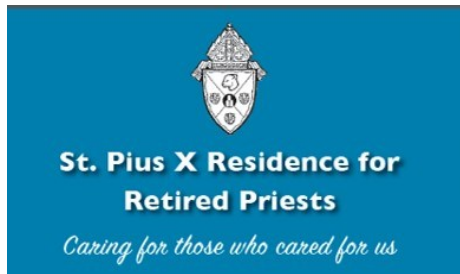

Relics of Padre Pio and Stone from the Cave of St. Michael (Italy) at St. Rose of Lima, Massapequa

In 1917, Padre Pio made a pilgrimage to the oldest Shrine in Western Europe, dedicated to Saint Michael the Archangel at Monte Sant' Angelo in Gargano (Puglia, Italy). He traveled with other townsfolk from San Giovanni Rotondo to pray to Saint Michael in "the Holy Grotto." On many occasions, Padre Pio would send penitents to the Shrine to pray for the intercession and protection of Saint Michael for the salvation of their souls. He encouraged his spiritual children to have devotion to the Holy Archangel, because "you will need the help of Saint Michael living in this world!"

How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. *(Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).*

Parish Prayer Intention Book: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

Prayer Line Ministry: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.

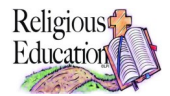
