

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way?"

"The two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread."

The two disciples in this Sunday's Gospel reading did not recognize Jesus until after they heard him explain the scriptures and then broke bread with him. It was a two-part process. First, while listening to him teach about the scriptures, only their hearts recognized him. ("Were not our hearts burning within us?") Their eyes didn't see his true identity until Jesus shared a meal with them, raised the bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them to eat. When we celebrate Mass today, we're on a similar journey with Jesus. First, we have the Liturgy of the Word during which we hear the scriptures and a homily that explains them. This is a time of opening our hearts to him.

A well-trained reader will speak the words of scripture with meaning and emphasis so that our hearts can recognize God in the words. A well-trained priest or deacon will set our hearts on fire as if Jesus himself were teaching us the meaning of the scriptures. But even when the reader or homilist does a poor job, we can open our hearts to hear Jesus speaking to us directly.

Then we move into the Liturgy of the Eucharist. When the presiding priest consecrates the bread and wine, it is Jesus himself who is actually doing it, using the priest's hands and vocal cords. Jesus is doing for us what he did for those two disciples at Emmaus.

If we have opened our hearts to Jesus during the first part of Mass, and if we are still paying attention, we see much more than a piece of bread and a chalice of wine. We see Jesus. We recognize him with our hearts *and* our heads. We know beyond all doubt that the resurrected Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CELEBRATIONS – This weekend is the first of several celebrations of the First Holy Communion of children who attend our school or are enrolled in our Faith Formation program. While the reception of the Holy Eucharist for the first time at or around the age of seven is a commonly accepted practice, it was not always the case.

In the Catholic Church's earliest days, infants received their First Communion along with the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. While Eastern Catholic Churches have upheld the tradition of infants receiving Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, in the Roman Rite, they began to be separated and administered at different ages. By the early 20th century Holy Communion was reserved for teenagers and adults. This was due to a prevailing thought that those who received Holy Communion must understand the sacrament as much as possible.

In 1910, Pope St. Pius X decreed that children who have reached the "age of reason" (around seven years old) were to be permitted to receive the Eucharist. Pius X wrote that children who are in the "happy state of innocence and purity of soul and who, amidst so many dangers and seductions of the present time, have a special need of this heavenly food."

It was Pius X's hope that by allowing little children to receive Holy Communion, their baptismal innocence would be strengthened, and they would stay close to the Lord as they advanced into their adult lives. This is still our hope today, over 110 years after Pope St. Pius' decision to make the Eucharist available to children. Today we see more clearly the dangers and temptations that our children face. As we heed the Lord's call to let the little children come to him, we pray for our children, and we make the cultivation of their faith and their relationship with the Lord a priority in our lives and the mission of the church.




