

...from Fr. Gerard

Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties...I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

In today's second reading, St. Paul offers his insights into the anxieties of daily living. He surmises that anxiety is unavoidable in life. And that the root of anxiety is found in those matters that occupy our time and attention. So Paul concludes in today's reading, it is probably better to be anxious about "the things of the Lord" rather than to be anxious about "the things of the world." As contemporary Christians, we continue to live in a world full of anxiety. Whether married or single, the modern world moves at a tremendous pace and applies many pressures to our daily living. But as Christians, we can find comfort and rest from our anxiety in listening to Jesus Christ.

Most of our anxiety comes not because we are married or single, have children, work demanding jobs, or are burdened with illness. Our anxiety comes from a desire to do the "right thing," live an upright life and be pleasing to God. Additionally, we are negotiating our way through anxiety brought about by global conflict, hostile political discourse, economic hardships, divided communities, and civil unrest. Whatever the case may be, none of us is free of anxiety. As a result, our anxiety distracts us from what is most important, journeying to our own salvation and bringing the presence of Christ to the world around us.

Anxiety and depression are actual mental and emotional afflictions that often go ignored. Seeking the assistance of mental and emotional health practitioners is essential and is in no way contrary to living our Christian faith. Our mental and emotional health matters as much as our spirituality because that's how God has made us. The integration of body, mind and soul are essential to living a life of joy and hope.

In addition to the resources of professional intervention, we can also make a commitment to proactively address what makes us anxious or fearful. In a 2014 interview, Pope Francis offered a list of ten ways to happiness. They are as follows: Live and let live. Be giving of yourself to others. Proceed calmly in life, Have a healthy sense of leisure. Sundays should be holidays, Create dignified jobs for young people. Respect and take care of nature. Stop being negative. Respect others' beliefs. Work for peace. A deliberate choice to enact one of these principles empowers us to refocus ourselves from what is fearful, to the more proactive path of not letting that which is harmful, to have power over me.

Keeping our eyes fixed on Christ and engaging in a prayerful dialogue with him brings us to the words he so often said, "Do not be afraid."

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK - Catholic education is an essential mission of our parish. That mission is fulfilled through the leadership of St. Rose of Lima Principal, Mr. Brian Jensen, and the dedicated efforts of teachers, staff, and parents. The mission is made possible, however, because of the shared commitment that all of us have to the formation of our children. I am very proud of not only the success our parish has had in the work of Catholic education, but in the success of our children who thrive because of the care and attention that this parish has given to Catholic schools and education in faith. Every member of our parish contributes to the mission of our school through your financial and prayerful support. On behalf of our school community, I thank the greater parish community for your generous and prayerful support of our school.

Our school is also blessed to have the support of other parish ministries dedicated to the formation of our youth. The leadership of our Faith Formation Coordinator, Mrs. Grace Rozea, our new Youth Minister, Mr. Adam Grand, and the Coordinator of our evangelization programs, Mr. Tom Griffin, support our school with their knowledge and commitment. Our extensive CYO program, Family Mass Committee, Music Ministry, Altar Servers, and Parish Social Ministry office all supplement what our children learn in the classroom.





How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (*Please note: 1*) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book:</u> A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you an write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>Prayer Line Ministry</u>: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.




