



...from Fr. Gerard

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her and found by those who seek her.

Today's first reading is taken from the Book of Wisdom, written about 100 years before the birth of Christ. The Book of Wisdom contains some of the finest wisdom traditions in Israel's history, dealing with a range of topics from the Exodus to God's mercy and justice. Today's reading personifies wisdom, highlighting some of the characteristics of wisdom (resplendent, unfading, and gracious), as well as some of the functions of wisdom (revealing, seeking, and finding). On a deeper level, the writer teaches us that wisdom is not a static virtue; rather, it is a dynamic force that interacts in the rhythm of our lives and integrates the many disparate parts of our lives into a healthy whole. Wisdom is not so much knowing what one values as it is valuing something that is worthy of our care. We celebrate choice, but choices are a dime a dozen. What is rare is the wise choice. Last week we engaged in wisdom as we made our election choices. This week, let us pray for the elected, that they may be inspired by a wisdom that comes from God.

ANNUAL REPORT – Last weekend I gave you a verbal account of our parish's financial and spiritual report. I am grateful for the positive responses I received from many of you after masses and throughout the past week. As promised, today's bulletin contains detailed financial and spiritual reports. The financial report can be found on the next page, and the spiritual report appears below. In addition to this printed follow-up, I wanted to offer one further elaboration on the school financial report.

As I said last weekend and can be viewed in the printed report, the school operated at a loss of over \$300,000. While this is important information, it does not tell the whole story regarding the school's financial health, a story that is a positive one overall.

First, the school had the savings to cover those costs and still ended the year with a positive fund balance. Second, the loss is consistent with what we had budgeted. We anticipated the need to draw from savings and remained close to the anticipated costs. In our budget for next year, we anticipate a loss that is only half of this year's. Our hopeful projection is that we will be able to balance the school's budget by the 2024-2025 school year. With realistic projections on increases in revenue, and decreases in expenditures, our business office, with the guidance of our finance committee believes that a balanced budget is achievable in the next two years. Beyond that, the parish remains committed to supporting the mission and ministry of the school and has the means to do so.
