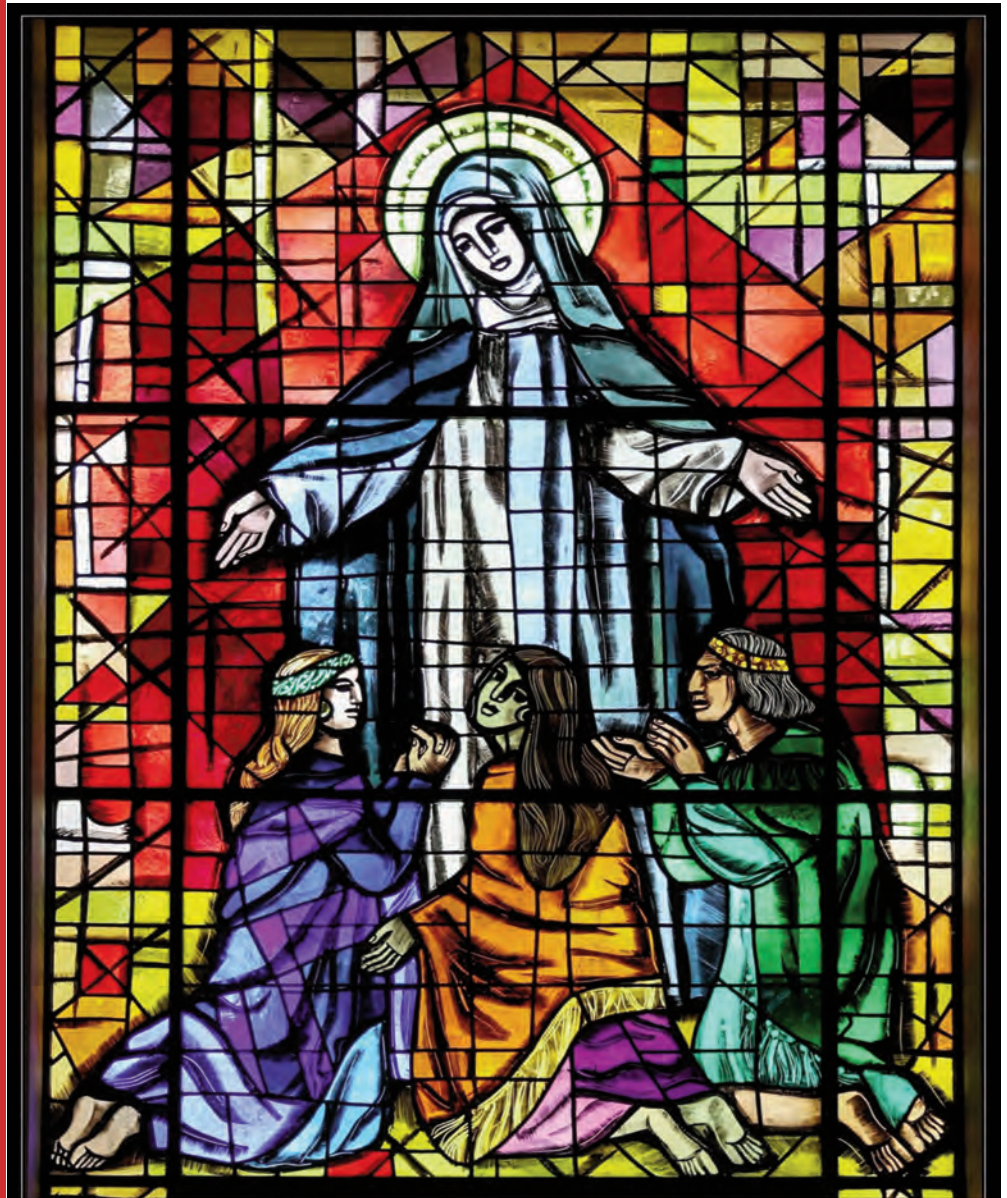

...from Fr. Gerard

In receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word, but as it truly is, the word of God, which is now at work in you who believe.

Throughout my 26 years as a priest, I am continually mindful of how blessed and privileged I am to serve the people of God. In addition, my last 14 years as a pastor has deepened my appreciation for the trust that has been given to me by the two parish families I have served. In today's second reading, St. Paul expresses his affection for the community he served at Thessalonica and his awareness of his role as a conduit between God and his people. I find that I can identify with these sentiments as I preach at all the masses this weekend and present to you an annual report on the state of our parish and its ongoing mission. What I share with you today comes from both my sense of duty and obligation as well as my passion to continue to lead us forward in mission.

In my talk today, I will share with you an update on our financial status and the foreseeable capital needs. I will also share with you some data and statistics regarding the administration of sacraments, pastoral activities, and communal service. I intend to follow up my talk with a printed financial and spiritual report in next week's bulletin.

Much of my report today will be a reflection on where we have been, where we are and where we hope to go as a parish community. In four years, we will mark the 75th anniversary of our parish. That upcoming milestone provides a motivating inspiration to look ahead with hopeful expectation as to what is to come for this community and the entirety of the church.

Having only been here for a little more than two years, I felt I needed some feedback from our parish community, and so I posed two questions to you. From those responses, I was able to develop a clearer sense of how all of you saw this parish community and what your dreams were for our future. I thought I would share a few highlights of those responses here.

Why do you choose to be a parishioner of St. Rose of Lima?

- I see and appreciate all the ways that people of all ages and degrees of participation are encouraged to participate in religious activities and build that sense of community/connectedness with each other as a parish.
- When we enter our church each weekend and holy days, it is an "I belong here" feeling and a "holy" feeling. This includes my family (including my young grandchildren) that get this feeling as well. The church's size is huge but never feels cold at heart.
- The parishioners, the priests, the staff, and the ministries - I felt welcome from my very first visit and interactions. In fact, we have physically moved away from the Parish area but still participate in our ministries at St. Rose of Lima.
- Initially I chose this parish because of relatives that are parishioners here. I stay here because I grew to be on fire for my faith after being called to join a ministry at St. Rose of Lima. I owe my conversion to this parish.

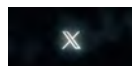
What are your future hopes for our parish?

- To be able to bring our children and youth to a new awareness of what Christ is to them and parents to be renewed with the importance of giving their children the most valuable gift of our catholic faith!
- I would like to see retreats, parish charity events, and increased enrollment at the school.
- I dream of a parish that is inclusive, inviting others to join, is missionary reaching out to as many people as possible. This is especially important in a parish the size of St. Rose.
- Basic teachings of theology. Perhaps some in-depth Bible study.
- Though we regularly donate to the food pantry, we would love to see more social action programs to participate in as a community.

This is just a sampling of the responses I received. I look forward to presenting my report to you this weekend and look forward to continued dialogue, listening and accompaniment.

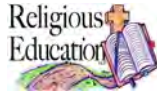
