

Thus, says the LORD: "Should you build me a house to dwell in? It was I who took you from the pasture and from the care of the flock...I will fix a place for my people Israel" The LORD also reveals to you that he will establish a house for you.

In the first reading of the 4th Sunday of Advent, the prophet Nathan cautions the great King David about building a dwelling place for the Lord God. The heart of the caution is that God cannot be contained. Furthermore, it is the Lord who establishes a dwelling place for us, not the other way around. The churches, temples, synagogues, and mosques that we erect are not meant to contain God or the life of faith. Rather, they act as places of worship for the faithful to assemble and acknowledge their relationship with God. For Christians, the church is a place of encounter from which we are sent forth. The church building, and the worship contained within it, is to reflect the eternal place that the Lord God has prepared for us. The physical structure of the church also serves as a reminder of the Incarnation, Christ dwells here in this church – and dwells within humanity and all of creation.

It is the Incarnation of the Word made flesh that we come together to celebrate this weekend; the last day of Advent, Christmas Eve, and beginning with the vigil Mass, the first day of the Christmas season. How will we occupy those few hours in between these two liturgical seasons? I pray that we can find time to recognize how God is incarnate in our lives right now. I hope that each of us can find some moments of quiet peace to reflect upon the divine mystery we celebrate, Mary's yes to the Father's desire to send the Son to dwell among us. Coming together during these days, we ponder anew that it is not we who create a place for God in our lives, but the Lord God who became flesh and dwells among us.

A PLACE CALLED "HOME" – Throughout this weekend, we welcome many people back home. Family members, friends, college students, and military personnel will travel great distances to be with loved ones, and in those gatherings, they will feel at home and maybe even recognize the presence of Christ in the "home" they create together.

In that same spirit, many will return home to Saint Rose of Lima this week. For the last several weeks, we have been preparing ourselves and our parish community to be a worthy home for the Lord. And so, it is now our opportunity to welcome Him. In a particular way, we welcome him as he comes in the broken-hearted, the estranged, the sorrowing, the poor, the afraid, the tired and the lonely. During these Christmas days, may all be welcomed as Christ.

CHRISTMAS GENEROSITY – Throughout these last several weeks, great efforts have been made to assure that all our friends and neighbors would have gifts, food and other essential items as their families come together this Christmas. I thank everyone who donated to the Advent Angels, CYO and School giving programs. I am especially grateful for the volunteers of our Family Mass Committee, CYO and Parish Outreach as well as Principal Brian Jensen, Faith Formation Administrator Grace Rozea, Parish Social Ministry Coordinators Sister Carol Radosti, and Ann Hedgis and CYO coordinators Lucy Weyer and Lisa Tramontana for the leadership and coordination of all these gift-giving opportunities.

CHRISTMAS GRATITUDE - I also thank all who have helped us to worship well this Advent and now Christmas. We are blessed with dedicated staff and volunteers who have prepared the church for the Christmas liturgies. Christmas 2023

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

In recent years at Christmas, I have meditated on the relationship between the Nativity of the Prince of Peace and the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

I have been especially inspired by Pope Francis' analysis of the Parable of the Good Samaritan in the second chapter of his 2020 encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*. It is powerful and provocative, and I would recommend it for your mental prayer.

The short phrase in the Christmas Gospel narrative in the second chapter of the Gospel of Luke reads: "She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

"No room for them in the inn." No Good Samaritan stepped up to help the Holy Family. They were ignored and treated perfunctorily and impatiently. Some passed them by. Some pretended not to notice their plight.

Remember too that in the Parable of the Good Samaritan an "inn" is also mentioned. Luke 10 reads: "But a Good Samaritan while traveling came near him, and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn and took care of him."

The inn that the Holy Family approaches on the way to Bethlehem is a sign of rejection and indifference.

The inn in the Parable of the Good Samaritan is a sign of the Good Samaritan's compassion and commitment to go the extra mile and to make sure that the wounded man is taken care of until he is completely healed.

Contemporary literary criticism might very well emphasize that the use of "inn" by the Gospel writer in both the Nativity in Luke 2 and the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10 is not by accident.

DIOGESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE

In a sense, the phrase "there was no room at the inn" in the Nativity foreshadows and connects with the phrase in the Parable of the Good Samaritan describing the callous indifference of both the priest and the Levite toward the wounded man on the side of the road: "[H]e passed by on the other side."

As Pope Francis says in *Fratelli Tutti*: "Each day we have to decide whether to be Good Samaritans or indifferent bystanders."

Our Lady, St. Joseph and the unborn Christ Child experienced the reality of people who decided to be indifferent bystanders.

The Christmas Gospel narrative from Luke 2 poses a question which is posed again later in the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10.

Will we be Good Samaritans?

Or will we be indifferent bystanders?

As the Holy Father reminds us, we make that choice every day.

May our prayer, silent contemplation and creative family catechesis of the Nativity scene help us to be instruments of a Nativity Mystery. May the Good Samaritan Gospel revolution of humility, charity, mercy, tenderness and peace unite us in solidarity with the sick, the poor and the suffering, especially in the Middle East, Ukraine and all war-ravaged areas of the world.

May our commitment to "holiness and mission" bless our contemplative Synodal listening and our Eucharistic Revival and Evangelization.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and your families!

May the Light and Love of the Christ Child animate and guide our global Catholic Missionary Spirit on this Christmas night and throughout the New Year.



More About the Main Feasts During Christmastide

Christmas and the Incarnation

"The Word was made flesh, and lived among us," John's Gospel tells us. This sums up the meaning of the term *Incarnation*: the eternal word, the second person of the Trinity, took on a human nature in the person of Jesus Christ. According to the Church councils of Nicaea (AD 325) and Chalcedon (AD 451), Jesus was both fully human and fully divine.

Holy Family

The general breakdown of family relationships at the end of the 19th century prompted Pope Leo XIII and others to promote the observance of the *Holy Family* feast with the hope that it might instill in Christian families something of the faithful love and the devoted attachment that characterize the family of Nazareth. The primary purpose of the Church in instituting and promoting this feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families.

Mary, Mother of God

Mary was decreed to be the Mother of God by the Council of Ephesus in AD 431 This title asserts the divinity of Christ as well as his humanity: he was born of woman, yet he was the Son of God. The Solemnity of *Mary Mother of God* commemorates this divine motherhood by not only honoring Mary, who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear God incarnate, but also honors Christ, who is fully God and fully human.

Epiphany

From the Greek word meaning *manifestation*, Epiphany refers to the manifestation of the Incarnation to human beings. Mary and then Joseph were the first to receive the revelation of Jesus' divinity. The traditional Epiphany text of the three Magi who brought gifts to Jesus is understood to signify the revelation of Jesus' divinity to the Gentiles. The baptism of Jesus as well as the wedding feast of Cana are also Epiphany stories in which the divinity of Christ was revealed, in the first case to the Jews and in the second to the disciples themselves.

The Baptism of the Lord

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord commemorates the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. Originally the baptism of Christ was celebrated on Epiphany, which then commemorated the coming of the Magi, the baptism of Christ, and the wedding at Cana. Over time, however, the celebration of Jesus' baptism came to be commemorated as a distinct feast from Epiphany and was set on a moveable date following Epiphany that also marks the end of the Christmas season in the liturgical calendar.

Activities following Christmas Day

In our society, much of the celebration of Christmas comes before December 25. For Christians, the days after Christmas provide a period of calm in which the spiritual meaning of the manifestation of Jesus, God-With-Us can be explored. The following activities help us appreciate the meaning of the Incarnation as the new year arrives.

- Take some time to look back upon the previous year and identify your personal "joyful mysteries," moments when God was especially present to you. Express your gratitude to God for these moments and your hope that you will experience more fully the presence of God in the new year.
- The slower pace of activity after December 25 makes this a good time for visiting with family and friends during these days. Reflect on how God is revealed to you especially in your relationships.
- Spend some time in silent prayer before the crib, the Christmas tree or in church. Invite God to touch your heart at the wonder of the Incarnation.



IRA Charitable Rollover Qualified Charitable Distribution

If you would like to make a gift to St. Rose using your IRA, you can if:

- 1. On the date you make the gift, you are at least 70 ½ years old*
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify), and
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions.

(*A Qualified Charitable Distribution can be made after 70½ even if you are not subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) yet. Speak with your tax specialist about new IRS rules on when you must take your RMD.)

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of Federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).


This is a unique opportunity to make a charitable contribution through a direct IRA transfer while reducing your adjusted gross income.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases, you will only have to fill out a simple form.


<u>VERY IMPORTANT</u>: Your gift must go directly from your IRA to our Parish. If you receive the money first, you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.






