

# ...from Fr. Gerard

# Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not?

The writings of the Prophet Isaiah conclude approximately 700 years before Jesus, yet they continue to serve as a guide for the anticipation of the Messiah throughout Advent. The Advent season also has a strong penitential tone, and the writings of Isaiah articulate the call to straighten out our crooked ways, tear down our mountains of misdeeds, and fill in the valleys of our bad habits. This is an essential disposition for us in these early days of Advent. Written before, during, and after the exile of the Jewish people in the Babylonian kingdom, the writings of Isaiah speak as a warning against an abandonment of the ways of God, a longing for liberation from captivity, and an awaiting of the Messiah who is still very much needed, even after the Israelites returned to their land. Our first reading for the next three Sundays will come from this last section of Isaiah which focuses us on both the waiting for, and the need of, a Messiah.

One of the challenges for Christians today is understanding why we need a savior. The simple answer is that our humanity is not enough to keep us from our self-destructive ways. In this third section of Isaiah, the audience is a people who have been liberated from captivity and yet have reverted to the sins of the past. Does this sound familiar? How many times in our lives have we gone through a period of renewal and the betterment of ourselves spiritually, emotionally, or physically, only to fall back into bad habits? Why can't God just fix us permanently? The people of Israel were of the same questions, seeing God as responsible for all things, even for allowing his people to wander from him. It is true that God does let us wander, but not for lack of care. Rather, it is so our choice for Him and our desire to be saved is authentic, true, and free. We are free to wander so that we may come to genuinely desire what contemporary Catholic singer and songwriter Matt Maher so beautifully proclaims, "Lord, I need You, oh, I need You. Every hour I need You. My one defense, my righteousness. Oh God, how I need You."

I often struggle with **not wanting** to want God. In those times, I find myself wanting God to **make** me desire him. Therefore, the grace I pray for this Advent season is to move from wanting God to make me feel his longing for me and instead, become more aware of my need and **desire for him**.

The Advent season is so short, only three weeks and half a day, not leaving much time for us to experience the unique graces of the season. Pressured for time, we can easily go through the motions, the rituals, the religious formalities and even an exclusivism that tempts us to look down on those who will only join us on Christmas Day. Therefore, let us take advantage of what Advent offers us; the opportunity to experience joyful anticipation and a true desire for the Savior who is born to redeem us.

**COMFORT AND JOY** - I am very excited that Sarah Hart and Steve Angrisano are bringing their special Advent tour to Long Island, specifically our parish. In the last two years, both have visited us separately, and we are blessed to have them here together this year for their very popular **Comfort and Joy Advent Concert**. They will be joining us for a special evening that hopes to unite the parish and school community together. On Friday, December 8, they will lead our music at 5:00 pm mass for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Immediately following mass, the Father's Club of our school will host a Christmas lighting event along with student caroling and snacks. Sarah and Steve will then present their concert beginning at 7:00 pm. **Please join us, and bring guests.** I promise this will be a truly blessed, joyful and uniting event for our parish.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION – This Friday, December 8, is a Holy Day of Obligation. On Thursday December 7, the vigil mass for the solemnity will be celebrated at 7:30 pm. Following mass, our parish will participate in the National Night of Prayer for Life. This holy hour of prayer will include Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Pro-Life Rosary Celebration, and Solemn Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament. On Friday, December 8, masses will be at 7:30 am, 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.

**ADVENT WREATH and JESSE TREE** – These two symbols of the season of Advent help to enhance our focus on the season of preparation. The Immaculate Conception is the doctrine that Mary, conceived in the normal way through an act of love by her mother and father (St. Joachim and St. Anne), was born free of original sin and its effects from the first moment of her existence. This special favor was conferred on her because of her role in God's plan

for our salvation. Historically, this doctrine has sometimes been

misunderstood as the conception of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit in the feast we know as the Annunciation. Instead, the Immaculate Conception celebrates the special gift of God's grace to Mary because she was to be

Uter consulting with the bishops of the Church, Pope Pius IX first solemnly defined the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception in 1854 in the Apostolic Constitution Ineffabilis Deus.

The Immaculate Conception has the distinction of being one of only two formal Church dogmas to be solemnly defined by the full teaching authority of popes rather than general Councils (the other being Mary's Assumption). This means that the Immaculate Conception has been solemnly defined as an infallible teaching to be believed by the whole Church. We not only believe that this is our truth, but we also try to imitate the meaning of this truth. While we honor Mary for the privilege of being without sin, we also try to be like her in becoming faithful bearers of Christ in the world. As we strive for greater integrity in our words and actions we allow God to work in us to help transform our world into one of greater justice and love. Thus we imitate Mary and become the kind of disciples that Jesus praises in the Gospel: "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it

(Luke 11:28).

# The Magnificat (C. & 1:46-55)

# Mary, Mother of the Church

Jesus gave Mary to the Church from the cross when he told his beloved disciple, "Behold your mother" (John 19:26-27). Mary was present in the upper room with the other disciples on Pentecost, when the Church was born (Acts 1:13-14). Over the centuries of Christianity, Mary has been sought out by the faithful who find in her support for their own lives of discipleship. As one whose own life of faith was not easy or simple, Mary is a companion who can show us a path in our everyday lives and in our suffering.

Mary is a wonderful example of what happens when one opens oneself to the life and power of God. As at the marriage at Cana, Mary always directs our attention to Jesus, saying "Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5). Mary is not a goddess wielding power. Neither is she controlling and domineering nor cold and aloof. Mary is there for us whenever we need her.

## WHY DEFINE THIS DOCTRINE?

The doctrine of Mary's Immaculate Conception affirms that through God's grace she was never separated from God by sin. Over the centuries Mary's freedom from original sin—the teaching that every human is born in the wrong relationship with God (this is what sin is and does) and so must be freed from this condition through God's grace (this is what salvation is and does)—was disputed by theologians who could not agree.

After consulting with the Bishops of the Church to confirm that almost all Catholics believed this doctrine, Pope Pius IX first solemnly proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854 in these words: We declare, pronounce and define that the doctrine which asserts that the Blessed Virgin Mary, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, was preserved free from every stain of original sin is a doctrine revealed by God and, for this reason, must be firmly and constantly believed by all the faithful.

## WHY DECEMBER 8?

December 8 is the liturgical celebration of Mary's Immaculate Conception, i.e., her being "adorned from the first moment of her conception with the splendors of an entirely unique holiness" (Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, #56). This date was chosen because it is 9 months (the time of a child's gestation in the mother's womb) before the traditional celebration of the feast of the Nativity of Mary on September 8.


# A Prayer for the Immaculate Conception

# Celebrating with the Advent Wreath

One way to prepare for Christ's coming into our lives is to make an Advent wreath for your daily household worship. This traditional circular wreath reminds us that God, like the circle, has no beginning and no end. Evergreens on the wreath symbolize our everlasting relationship with God, the source of continuous new life.

The wreath has four candles, three purple or violet and one rose. On the First Sunday and Week of Advent, we light the first candle and then an additional candle on each Sunday until Christmas. Purple is a royal color, reflecting the kingship of Christ and also repentance. The rose candle, lighted on the Third Sunday of Advent, represents joy. Thus, the colors of the candles illustrate the themes of Advent: kingship, repentance and joy. The candles also remind us that the incarnation has transformed the darkness of hatred and evil into the light of joy and love.

Let your Advent wreath become the center around which your household gathers together each night during this joyous, but sometimes frenzied, season of celebration. And as you celebrate with the Advent wreath, include your favorite Advent hymns and songs, scripture readings and prayers focusing on Christ's threefold Advent—past, present and future.

# THE "O ANTIPHONS"

The O Antiphons refer to the seven verses that are recited (or chanted) preceding the Magnificat during Vespers of the Liturgy of the Hours. They cover the special period of Advent preparation known as the Octave before Christmas, December 17-23. These antiphons form the basis of the Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," put to music in 15th century France.

**December 17**—O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation.

**December 18**—O Sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.

**December 19**—O Flower of Jesse's Stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.

**December 20**—O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling at your will the gate of heaven: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom.

**December 21**—O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice, come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.



# **IRA Charitable Rollover Qualified Charitable Distribution**

If you would like to make a gift to St. Rose using your IRA, you can if:

- 1. On the date you make the gift, you are at least 70 ½ years old\*
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify), and
- 3. 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions.

(\*A Qualified Charitable Distribution can be made after 70½ even if you are not subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) yet. Speak with your tax specialist about new IRS rules on when you must take your RMD.)

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of Federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

This is a unique opportunity to make a charitable contribution through a direct IRA transfer while reducing your adjusted gross income.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases, you will only have to fill out a simple form.

**VERY IMPORTANT**: Your gift must go directly from your IRA to our Parish. If you receive the money first, you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.



# WHAT IT TAKES TO MAKE A QCD



The QCD must come from a Traditional or Inherited IRA.



Beneficiary must be at least 70 1/2.



The distribution must go directly to a qualified charity.





You must receive a confirmation letter from the charity that states no goods or services were received in exchange for the contribution.


