### ...from Fr. Gerard

Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.

Just how important is love? St. John makes it absolutely clear, love is of utmost importance, for without it we cannot know God. Such a statement is both encouraging and also somewhat troubling. If we have experienced true, unconditional, sacrificial love from our spouse, parents, children, or others, we have had authentic encounters with the divine. But what of those who don't know love? What of those who have been abused, abandoned, tortured, and forgotten? If they have not had experiences of true, unconditional, sacrificial love, have they been deprived of an authentic experience of the divine? If the answer is "yes," do we not, as Christians, have the responsibility to correct this wrong?

In his teaching letter, God is Love, Pope Benedict XVI wrote,

"Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction."

We take on the identity of Christian because we believe we have encountered Jesus Christ in word, sacrament and the lived community of faith. We are, therefore, obliged to live the commandment of Jesus Christ to *"love one another as I have loved you."* The Lord gives us this command because he recognizes that there are many who have not known love, and therefore, do not know Him. In that same encyclical, Pope Benedict speaks of this commandment as a response to what we have been freely given:

"The 'commandment' of love is only possible because it is more than a requirement.

Love can be 'commanded' because it has first been given."

We may struggle when we are told that this commandment is to be applied to our enemies as well. But do we not want our enemies to know God, and therefore, come to conversion and reconciliation? More than ever, our world needs to know love and to know God. We who have encountered God through the experience of love are called to fulfill our vocation to love as we have been loved, and so reconcile the world.

I recently heard a talk given by Bishop Robert Gruss of the Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan. The talk was about forgiveness and in that context, he said, "*People are not our enemies*. *I don't care what you think about their behaviors*. *People are not enemies*. *Hatred itself is the enemy*." He broadened the context to include those beyond our own circle because as he acknowledges, we are allowing our hatred for public figures to harbor bad, negative, resentful feelings toward them. Bishop Gruss rightly stated that these thoughts and emotions are going to come out in ways that affect us and others. Love and resentment cannot coexist. We are called to choose love.

**The ASCENSION OF THE LORD** - Each church year, 40 days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, a key component in the paschal mystery. The ascension and glorification of the risen Christ speaks to the final phase in Jesus "passing over" from earth to heaven. It is also in this moment that Jesus gives the commission to his disciples to preach, teach, evangelize, and baptize all nations. Celebrating this important feast day together helps us to understand our connection to the mission of Jesus Christ, to sanctify the world and go before us to the heavenly kingdom. The Feast of the Lord's Ascension is an essential component of the Easter mystery. Ascension Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please see the schedule for the masses in today's bulletin and plan to attend.

### Church Door Renovation Project We are happy to announce the planned renovation of new doors for our church

As our parish approaches our 75th anniversary, plans to replace our nearly 70 year old doors are underway. Over the last few years, attempts have been made to repair doors that have broken mechanisms and rotting interiors. Replacement parts are hard to come by and the repair of one door alone cost over \$1,000.

Newly designed doors will also allow for increased safety, energy efficiency, and accessibility. Tinted glass windows will bring light into vestibules and allow users to see into and out of the building, increasing safety through greater visibility. The newly designed doors will operate with greater ease and will not be as heavy as the current doors.

The project is scheduled to take place this summer and will cost an estimate of \$90,000.

How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners, and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:

<u>Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin</u>: Please call the rectory (516.798.4992) during regular business hours to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass).

**<u>Parish Prayer Intention Book</u>**: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

<u>Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box</u>: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

<u>**Prayer Line Ministry:</u>** Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.</u>

*For the Military*: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military and we will print the person's name, and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a monthly basis.
