Epiphany





...from Fr. Gerard

See darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory.

Today's feast of the Epiphany is a manifestation that Jesus is Lord, not merely of the Jews but of all peoples. The Church formally teaches that the light of the Holy Spirit shines not only in Jewish and Christian hearts, but in all people of goodwill. The Second Vatican Council document "The Church in the Modern World" puts this truth simply and elegantly.

All this holds true not only for Christians, but for all men of goodwill in whose heart grace works in an unseen way. For, since Christ died for all men, and since the ultimate vocation of man is in fact one and divine, we ought to believe that the Holy Spirit, in a manner known only to God, offers to every man the possibility of being associated with the paschal mystery (#22).

The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, which we celebrate at every mass, was a sacrifice for all, whether they knew or believed in him or not. The Magi are a symbol of all humanity who walk in darkness seeking light and hope.

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING - The blessing of the doors with a chalk inscription above each door is a New Year custom. The inscription "C + M + B" signifies Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, the traditional names of the Wisemen or *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* which is Latin for "***Christ Bless this House.***" The numerals on either side of the initials indicate the year. You can follow this tradition in your home with chalk or use the image below.

AN END OF YEAR EXAMINATION by Thomas Griffin, Coordinator of Parish Evangelization

I have been fortunate enough to get to know Fr. Mark-Mary Ames, CFR over the years. He is a great man and holy priest who seeks to serve God each and every day. In listening to one of his talks last year, I stumbled upon a practice that has truly been one of the most fruitful spiritual exercises of my year. It is called an end of year examination of conscience.

For centuries, the Catholic Church has recommended and encouraged the practice of a daily examination of conscience. This can be done, in prayer, at the end of one's day. It is tailored from the manner in which someone can prepare to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The difference between preparing for the sacrament and the daily examination is that the nightly exercise also includes reflecting on what one is grateful for first, then leads into the ways in which we have fallen into sin.

The end of year examination seeks to take the daily practice of the examen and bring it to the entirety of one's previous calendar year. It can be done by those who pray a nightly examination or those that don't. It can be accomplished over the course of two evenings. On the first night, you can focus on what you are most grateful for from this year, and on the second night, you can focus on the ways that you fell short this year.

The best practical way to accomplish the examination is to sit in a quiet place and enter into silence. Then ask God for the vision to see this past year with His eyes. Writing bullet points down in a journal or notebook is also helpful and allows you to prayerfully reflect on the highs and lows from the year.

I'll be completely honest. At first, I was reluctant about the practice and thought that there was no reason to re-live my sins from the year. However, I was completely wrong. This practice has made me more thankful for all the gifts in my life, but also more aware of how God is challenging me to grant Him access to all aspects of my life. Leading into the new year, I become more joyful and excited about the blessings of life and more attuned to how God is calling me to move away from sin and towards Him.



Living out Christmas in the New Year


How do we live out the message of Christmas in the New Year, rather than pack it away with the ornaments?

Each year, the Octave Day of Christmas falls on the first day of the New Year, on which we also celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God.

We are called to place our trust in Him, to enter compassionately into the suffering of others, and to love one another as Christ loves us. Like Our Blessed Mother welcomed Jesus, we are called to cherish and protect the gift of human life, at every stage and in every circumstance.

One way to live out the message of Christmas and follow Our Lady’s example is to *pray 9 Days for Life, a novena for the protection of human life taking place January 16-24*. Each day of the novena features a different prayer intention, a short reflection, and more.



IRA Charitable Rollover

Qualified Charitable Distribution

This is a unique opportunity to make a charitable contribution through a direct IRA transfer while reducing your adjusted gross income, even under the new July 2025 tax rules.

If you would like to make a gift to St. Rose of Lima using your IRA:

- It must be a direct transfer.
- The IRA owner must be age 70½ or older at the time of the distribution.
- The donor must keep the QCD within the annual aggregate limit.
- **The QCD must be processed by December 31** to qualify for tax benefits in that tax year. (Donors should start the process in early December to ensure ample time.)

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a “qualified charitable distribution.” In most cases, you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT: Your gift must go directly from your IRA to our Parish. If you receive the money first, you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.



WHAT IT TAKES TO MAKE A QCD

-  The QCD must come from a Traditional or Inherited IRA.
-  Beneficiary must be at least 70 ½.
-  The distribution must go directly to a qualified charity.
-  You must receive a confirmation letter from the charity that states no goods or services were received in exchange for the contribution.

How Do I Request Prayer for myself or someone I love at St. Rose of Lima?

Our parish receives numerous prayer requests from parishioners and non-parishioners, for a variety of needs, but mostly for those who are experiencing an illness. Following is a list of opportunities for prayer in our parish:


Prayers for the sick from the pulpit and in our weekly bulletin: Please call the rectory during regular business hours (516-798-4992) to add your name to this list. Names are mentioned from the pulpit during all Masses for one week, and are then transferred to the bulletin for a period of three weeks. (*Please note: 1) For privacy reasons, if you are requesting prayers for someone other than yourself, you must have the permission of the person being prayed for to add their name to this list. 2) If a name is not announced, please know that they are not forgotten, as we pray for all those who are ill and convalescing at every Mass.*)

Parish Prayer Intention Book: A book is located in the church narthex by the statue of St. Rose of Lima, where you can write your prayer request. These prayers can be for any reason, including for those serving in the military, and will be included collectively in our Sunday and weekday Mass intentions.

Charismatic Prayer Group prayer box: There is a box located on the shelf in the church vestibule - the entrance from the parking lot by the sacristy door - where you can place your request for prayers. Each week, the members of the Charismatic Prayer Group check the box, and the prayer requests are divided amongst the members. They will pray for your needs during their meeting on Wednesday afternoons, and continue at their homes. Paper and pencil are available by the prayer box for your convenience.

Prayer Line Ministry: Call or email (mariap@srolchurch.org) the rectory to request prayers. Members of this ministry receive a weekly list of names of people in need of prayer and pray for them in the privacy of their own home. Only first names are used to protect the privacy of the individual being prayed for.

For the Military: Call the rectory to request prayers for those serving in the military, and we will print the person's name and the branch they serve in, in the bulletin on a recurring basis.






